



**SALAMANDERS OF PFEIFFER
NATURE CENTER—LILLIBRIDGE**

This list represents common salamanders that live at Pfeiffer Nature Center’s Lillibridge Property. The old-growth forest provides excellent habitat with it’s rich soil and vernal pools.

The site is home to 12 of the 18 species of salamanders that are found in New York State.

Salamanders can be observed mating in the pools in early spring. Late summer / early fall is the best time to see the widest selection of salamanders on the forest floor.
