#### From the nature desk...

In the darkest nights of the year, as winter settles in around the solstice, I feel a deep connection to the land here in Western New York. The air is sharp and still and all the experiences of summer and fall begin to crystalize as the earth hardens with frost.

On the full moon in December, a group of chilly hikers gathered at Pfeiffer to celebrate the beauty of the night and the darkness before the return of the light. Together, we navigated the icy forest, marveling at animal tracks illuminated under the moon. It was a magical night.

This first winter full moon is known as the Oak Moon in many Celtic traditions. To me, this seems perfect and meaningful. I've lived close to the earth for many years. One of the things that has always profoundly impacted me during the most frigid days is the deafening silence that settles onto the land. It can be lonesome at times, without the sounds of insects, animals, birds, grasses, running water and a rustling forest. But even during the darkest time of the year, I find joy in the mighty oaks. They seem to stand resolute in the cold, holding on to their leaves long after autumn has passed. I've always found something beautiful in this unique quality—how the brown, dried oak leaves cling through winter, rustling in the wind like memories that refuse to fade. The sound of the wind stirring through the oak's leaves has become one of my favorite "sounds of life" in the depths of winter. It's a soft rattle that seems to sing... "Endure, reflect, hold on." There's a quiet wisdom in the sound. Winter is a time for coziness. It's the season to gather by the fire and sing songs, to dream, to write new stories and revisit old ones. The long, dark nights also invite a slower pace. It's a chance to craft, to create, and to retreat. There's something sacred about this time of year—a moment to connect with ourselves and our loved ones. A time to appreciate what brightens our darkest days and sustains us for the year ahead.









